

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF PERRYSVILLE, INDIANA

ORDINANCE NO. 1, 1977

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE OPERATING OR HAVING CONTROL OF ANY MOTOR VEHICLE WEIGHING A GROSS WEIGHT OVER EIGHT TONS WITHIN THE TOWN OF PERRYSVILLE, INDIANA, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES.

WHEREAS, the streets of the town of Perrysville, Indiana, are badly damaged, in an unsafe condition and are in need of major and costly repairs and immediate steps should be taken to prevent further damages and thereby furthering the existing unsafe conditions, it is hereby found and declared by the TRUSTEES that the prompt passage of this Ordinance is urgent and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF PERRYSVILLE, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: No person shall operate or control a motor vehicle of a gross weight over eight tons upon a public street or alley in the town of Perrysville, except Main street (formerly State Road 63) and Indiana State Road 32, during the period of January 1st through April 1st each year.

SECTION 2: Penalty. Any person convicted of violating the terms of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine in the amount not exceeding \$ 500.00.

SECTION 3: Repeal. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances conflicting with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: Effect. This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its publication according to law.
