

ORDINANCE FOR CONSTRUCTION OF SIDEWALKS IN PERRYSVILLE INDIANA.

SECTION I

It is ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Perryville in the state of Indiana, that all side walks within the town of Perryville shall be built and constructed by said property owners and at their expense, with the exception of the street crossings and alley ways, which shall be built and constructed by the said town at the expense of said town.

SECTION II

It is further ordained, that said side walks shall be of a uniform width and construction, to wit; Four (4) feet in width, with a one (1) inch curb on all from the inside to the outside of said side walk upon and in compliance with the grade levels and property line levels to be established by a competent engineer selected by said town, whose services shall be paid for by said property owners.

SECTION III

It is further ordained, that said side walks shall be constructed of uniform good material, to wit; Portland cement, or its equivalent, sand and gravel.

Said side walks to be composed of a mixture of cement and gravel in the proportions of one to five, a thickness of not less than four (4) inches, with a top composed of cement and sand, proportions of one and one-half (1 1/2) to one (1), and a thickness of not less than one (1) inch.

SECTION IV

This ordinance shall be in full force from and after its passage. Passed June 2nd 1924, in a regular meeting of said town board by the following vote:-
